## BMCA General Meeting Minutes

**Date/Time:** Tuesday, February 28, 2011 / 7:00-9:00 PM

**Location:** Arlington Community Church

### **Minutes:**

1. Welcome and introductions (Mike McComis). Conducted by BMCA President Mr. Mike McComis.

- Due to scheduling issues, the meeting's guest speakers (Allison Denton and John Chadwick of Arlington County Schools) kicked off the meeting with their presentation. The specifics of their presentation will be discussed below under "New Business".

2. Approval of Minutes (Mike McComis). Copies of the minutes were made available to all meeting attendees. In the future the General Meeting minutes will also be available on the BMCA website. The BMCA President asked for a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was made (Rich Massabny), seconded (Chris Braudy) and approved by unanimous vote.

3. Treasurer's Report (Mike McComis for Rob Pilot). Mr. McComis provided a verbal summary of the Treasurer's Report (with copies available for all present and included to this report as Attachment #1). The current balance of funds is \$6,516.53.

- 2012 Budget. Mr. McComis also presented the 2012 BMCA Budget, which had been prepared by the budget sub-committee consisting of Mr. McComis and Mr. Pilot and which has been favorably endorsed for approval by the BMCA Board. After some discussion, a motion was made (Paul Svercl) to approve the 2012 BMCA Budget as submitted, seconded (Tony Ermovick) and unanimously approved. A copy of the 2012 budget is included to these minutes as Attachment #2.

4. Committee Reports.

- Membership (Mike McComis for Matt Smith). Matt Smith has now replaced Judy Norton as the BMCA Membership Committee chairperson. The 2012 membership drive is now underway, with membership forms and return envelopes having been provided as part of the most recent BMCA newsletters.
- Hospitality (Mike McComis for Claudia Maloney): A summary of the 2012 BMCA social events was provided by Mr. McComis, including the Easter Egg Hunt, the Annual Community Picnic, the Veteran's Day Dinner, and the annual holiday Christmas caroling. The Washington-Lee High School football game "tailgater" will not be held this year due to minimal participation the past two years.
- Neighborhood Conservation Plan (NCP) (Mike McComis for Matt Doyle): Mr. McComis provided an overview of ongoing NCP initiatives, as follows:

- Micro Projects: A brief summary of the County's "Micro projects" program was provided. This program is sponsored by Arlington County who will fund civic association improvement projects for up to \$10,000. Mr. McComis suggested we submit a project for a sidewalk from Manchester along the ramp to the park, parallel to the parking lot, to make it safer for pedestrians.
- Missing Links. A brief summary of the County's "Missing Links" program which residents can submit projects for areas where sidewalks or curbs are missing in their neighborhood. At this time no projects have been identified for BMCA.
- Montague Road Traffic Safety Improvements. This project is a NCP project that was designed and constructed by the County. Some construction delays have been encountered. Final asphalt work will be completed once the warmer weather returns in the spring.
- Reevesland. The Milner facility condition study has been completed and is available for viewing. In summary, it states that the facility is essentially in the same condition as it was when the original Milner study was conducted several years ago. It also lays out three possible reuses for the facility (residential, non-profit use with light kitchen, and non-profit use with larger kitchen), with renovation prices ranging from \$1.0 million to \$1.3 million. A County sponsored working group is ongoing, with BMCA participation. Additionally, the County has developed a Request-for-Proposal (RFP) to seek out interest in possible reuses of the facility. An information session is scheduled for March 8<sup>th</sup>. BMCA leadership has indicated to the County that we desire to have participation in the RFP and selection process.

d. Safety (Mike McComis for Chuck Norton). No significant crimes have been noted in the area. However, there were some iPads recently stolen from the Ashlawn School library. An investigation is ongoing. There is a new Watch Commander for the BMCA area. However, our main POC remains Corporal Lennon.

e. Parks (Mike McComis for Phil Klingelhofer). There are some final plantings around the new Bluemont Park playground that will occur this spring. Additionally, the Parks Department is sponsoring an invasive species removal for the stream area.

f. Zoning (Dormant). No report.

## 5. Old Business.

- a. Lancaster Farm Fresh Cooperative Program. Chris Braudy again shared information about the Lancaster Farm Fresh Cooperative Program, in which local residents can sign up to have produce and other items delivered to your neighborhood. The website for the program is [www.lancasterfarmfresh.com](http://www.lancasterfarmfresh.com).

6. New Business.

a. Arlington Schools Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Presentation. Ms. Alison Denton and Mr. John Chadwick provided a detailed presentation on the ongoing Arlington County Schools CIP. They discussed the CIP process, provided a detail brief which noted that the County schools will have approximately 7,000 seat deficiency in 10 years. Copies of handouts were provided and are included as Attachments (3) through (5). The next CIP work session is scheduled for March 21<sup>st</sup> at Kenmore Middle School, where their goal will be to identify “option sets.” Steps after that are: refine & develop a preferred option set, conduct public hearings, finalize the CIP, and develop interim plans (to include possible re-districting.

b. Reevesland Learning Center. Ms. Joan Horwitt discussed the ongoing effort to use the Reevesland property for a new Learning Center. Past success with the “Lawns 4 Lettuce 4 Lunch” and the Reevesland Learning Garden were also discussed. The County Board will discuss this issue at their March 20<sup>th</sup> session (6:30 PM), and all supporters are enthusiastically invited to attend to help show support for the initiative. Ms. Horwitt emphasized the proposed Reevesland Learning Center’s mission if for bringing together food, knowledge and community.

c. Boundary Issue. Mr. McComis discussed a boundary change issue that was addressed to him by the Carlin Springs Civic Association. The issue deals with a small section of land that is currently showing up on two civic association maps (near Carlin Springs Road). Discussions on this are ongoing with the County and Carlin Springs Civic Association.

d. New BMCA Website: Mr. McComis provide a summary overview of the new BMCA website. This website significantly expands the current website, and allows individual trusted individuals to access and load up data onto it. The website is now active and can be accessed at <http://www.boulevardmanor.org> . Many thanks to Mr. Matt Smith for setting up this new website!

c. Nominating Committee. Mr. McComis discussed the lack of response in obtaining any volunteers for the Nominating Committee. Consequently, he asked for a motion on allowing him to pursue nominating of potential new BMCA officers and Board members via the website. A motion was made (Phil Klingelhofer) to allow the BMCA President to conduct an on-line (or any other means) nomination for new BMCA officers and Board members. The motion was seconded (Chris Braudy) and unanimously approved.

d. Park Outfall/Stream Stabilization & Clean-up: Mr. McComis discussed a stream cleaning and shore stabilization program that the County was initiating. Though various County streams will have some stabilization work done on them this year under this program, the streams near BMCA are not on this year’s priority list, but maybe be considered in next year’s program for scheduled work.

e. Road Improvement at the Intersection of Rt. 50 and Manchester Blvd. An Arlington County representative has notified the BMCA President about an upcoming project that is under development to improve the pedestrian walk-way on the northwest corner of the Rt. 50 and Manchester Blvd. This plan is still under development. This representative is tentatively scheduled to present the conceptual plan at the June 2012 BMCA General Meeting.
