Neighborhood Celebrates Manchester/Route 50 Entrance "Grand Opening"

On Sunday, September 21, neighbors gathered to recognize the Manchester Street and Route 50 Intersection Corners Rejuvenation and Beautification Project. Josh Handler, the BMCA Conservation and Beautification Committee Chairman, began the project in 2020. Josh organized and led volunteers who contributed hundreds of hours of labor to improve the landscaping of the east and west corners of the intersection. Their efforts emphasized clearing of invasive species and installation of native Virginia plants, bushes and trees.

The east corner now features a short walkway where visitors can see native plants and flowers. As part of the grand opening celebration, Josh welcomed BMCA residents and provided a guided walkthrough of both corners. BMCA President Chris Tighe recognized Josh and the project team with a Certificate of Appreciation from the civic association.

Funding for the project came from the BMCA general budget and several neighbors' additional donations – for which we are very grateful – to the Conservation and Beautification Committee. Landscape contractor Environmental Outdoor Solutions (owned by a Boulevard Manor resident) volunteered their services, which significantly helped the work move forward.

This project has noticeably improved the appearance of one of the main entrances to our neighborhood. Beautification efforts are continuing, along with ongoing maintenance such as mowing of the grass area. As always, we

This spring we will be celebrating our 15th year of re-imagining the iconic and historic vegetable garden which provided food for three generations of the Torreyson-Reeves Family.

In The Reevesland Learning Garden, students and neighbors honor the legacy of Louise and Nelson Reeves by learning how to grow our own food and grow our community by highlighting our own home-grown skills and talents. Ashlawn classes visit the garden for hands-on lessons in science, history, language arts and math. Every Tuesday, we take our extra organic produce to the food pantry at Our Lady Queen of Peace Catholic Church.

We are a non-profit run by volunteers and we love seeing students and neighbors get excited about growing food and sharing their experiences. We partner with the Ashlawn PTA and at least once a year treat the whole school to a Fiesta Salad

of our own lettuce topped with twelve other healthy ingredients and neighbor Ron Battocchi's family recipe vinaigrette.

Last year, we celebrated the 15th anniversary of this LAWNS 2 LETTUCE 4 LUNCH project. Many of YOU have participated over the years to make this a huge success. Thank you for your enthusiasm and support.
